We often talk about what is currently going on in the child care industry such as changes to the Child Care Subsidy System as well as any changes, updates that may be relevant to our families. With close to 200 active families and 40 employees who read our newsletter we encourage our staff and families for input on anything from upcoming yard sales, local events or community notices.

The weather as expected has taken a nosedive to the teens during the day and the single digits over night and early morning. Our educators at the Long Day Care centers have adapted the routine to allow for more indoor time, especially early morning, later in the afternoon and during morning tea. The children unlike us seem to have no issue with the cooler

weather and still have the desire to be outside playing! At times during the day we will still be going outside both on the veranda and in the sunshine on the playgrounds. Please be aware that this is still vital for their growth and education! QK Kiosk → Lil'AntZ Communication

Since implementing the Kiosk 12 months ago Lil'Antz as a company has greatly reduced our use of paper and printing. Between all services we would print 6 rolls per day which was around 10-12 pages daily, around 2,500 pieces of paper each year just for rolls!

Recently parents would have noticed the removal of our Parent Pockets. To reduce our carbon footprint further notices such as your child being involved in an incident, notification of illness at our center, reminders about special events etc are all uploaded to your Kiosk system. Please ensure you read and acknowledge all communication listed. If you ever have any questions or want more information about what has been noted please speak with Management or your Team Leader!

Clothing at Care

Please ensure children have a spare set of clothes in their bags to cater to all weather conditions (jumper, shorts, T-shirt, socks, shoes etc!)

We also ask that parents clearly label all children's clothing with child's First & Last name! To ensure the correct item goes home with the correct child!

We have donated a large quantity of nice almost brand new jumpers to the Women's Shelter as they have not found their way home after being in our lost property for weeks.

Please also note that a beanie is not an acceptable form of sun protection and children will still be required to wear their hat.

Lost Property:

- From today the first Friday of every month will be our Lost Property Clean out. Any items left in the lost property box will be donated to Charity. This applies to all our services.

Long Day Care Nappy Changes:

- On 1 May 2019 we announced changes to our nappy process, offering for parents to provide their own nappies or for Lil'Antz to continue to provide nappies for a small fee. This is to help cover the ever-increasing cost of consumables and shipping to Alice Springs.
- Please note you can only change your nappy preference the first of every month.
- Don't forget to email the office about holidays nappy fees are not charged for two or more consecutive absences with notification.
- Notifications of nappy supplies will be posted on the Kiosk and/or verbally by educators.


Absent Days:

As you may be aware the Child Care Subsidy System allows all children 42 authorized absent days in a financial year. As we near the end of this financial year some families have exceeded these days. Please note for additional absent days a medical certificate by a medical practitioner must be provided. Without a certificate from your doctor with your child's name and dates absent you will not receive Child Care Subsidy. This only applies for the days absent that are over this 42 allowable. These 42 allowable absent days will refresh on 1 July 2019.
